A DAY IN THE LIFE OF ARTERRA →



We are around 40 people living in Arterra, representing different ages and nationalities, counting around 30 residents and 10 long term volunteers. You might not see us much during the day, as we are probably busy with our own jobs. Many of us work from home, some online others not. A few of us travel to neighbouring towns and cities to do so. We have diverse professional backgrounds.

In the project, we have many different sociocratic circles, where we carry out community tasks. From the shared kitchen, to the garden, from the swimming-pool to the corridors, we are like secret elves that take care of the visible and invisible in this shared dream together.





THE BUILDING



GET TO KNOW
THE PLACE



Built in the early 50s, this building this was first a religious school, and then it transformed into a rural hotel, offering spa services at the foothills of the Pyrenees. We first arrived in 2014 and since then, we rent out this 8.000 square meter palace. Much work has been done since then, doing what we can to turn our home into a safe, kind and sustainable building. It might seem overwhelming at first, but you will eventually find your way around!

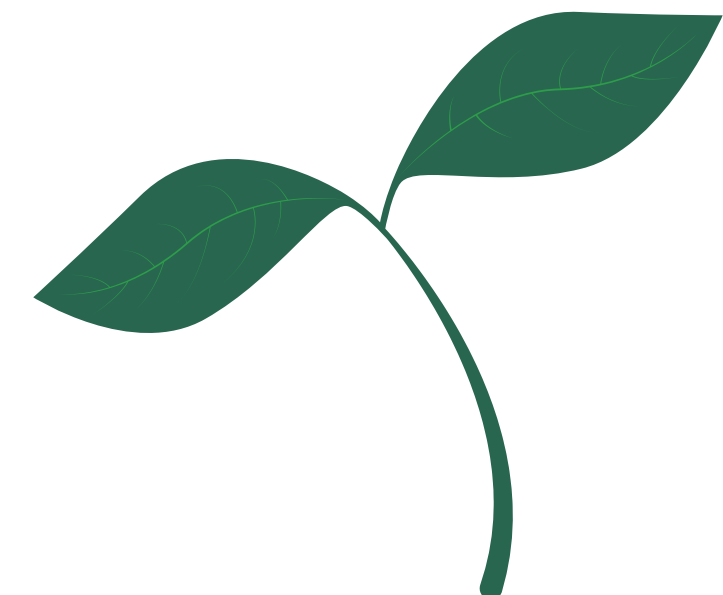

One of Arterra's main vocations is to be a space for live learning, where we can share knowledge, feeling and action that empower us towards ecosocial transition. We have many multipurpose indoor spaces, some of them holding up to 300 people: Terraria, Aquaria, Eterea and the Chapel.





THE OUTDOORS

LIFE OUTSIDE THE BUILDING

We have plenty of outdoor spaces, from indoor patios to grassy gardens. We also have plenty of space dedicated to our vegetable gardens, which produce delicious organic food for our shared kitchen, and some families also have their little plot. You can also encounter the chickens and sheep that live here! In less than 5 minutes walk, you reach the banks for the Irati River.

ACCOMMODATION *IN* ARTERRA

- ① 1 room with doble bed. Maximum 2 pax
- ② 1 room with doble bed. Maximum 2 pax
- ③ 2 rooms with a single bed and 1 bunk bed each. Maximum 6 pax
- ④ 2 rooms with a single bed and 1 bunk bed each. Maximum 6 pax
- ⑤ 1 room with a double bed and 2 bunk beds. Maximum 4 pax
- ⑥ 2 rooms with a total of 5 bunk beds. Maximum 10 pax
- ⑦ 2 rooms with a total of 5 bunk beds. Maximum 10 pax
- ⑧ 1 room with a double bed, 1 room with a single bed. Maximum 3 pax

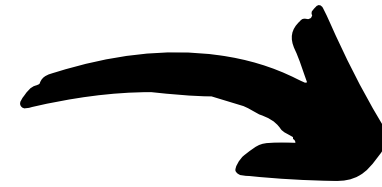

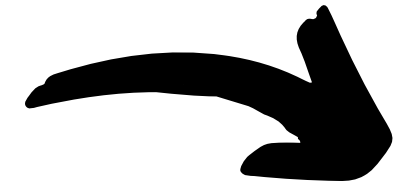

SHARED AGREEMENTS *IN* ARTERRA



- ① Read the signs. There are many signs in Arterra that help us understand the do's and don't's. Keep an eye out for them and follow their advice.
- ② No paper down the toilet please! We also have some great compost toilets outside!
- ③ If you do bring your pet, remember that in common spaces (in and out) it should be tied up and supervised at all times
- ④ The common kitchen is only a shared place for those who live in Arterra. Please do not enter without permission.
- ⑤ For many of us, this is our home. Please respect our private spaces and remember to close doors at night after you come in, also keep the noise down after 11pm



- ⑥ Tidy up after yourselves, and leave it better than you found it. Everyone washes up their own dishes after eating. We're in this together!
- ⑦ Be mindful about the use of water and electricity. The change starts now!
- ⑧ Please don't help yourself to the veggies in the garden
- ⑨ No smoking indoors, and there's plenty of ashtrays outdoors for cigarette ends
- ⑩ If and when in doubt, ask a community member, we're happy to help and explain so we can all have fun, enjoy community life and feel a part of this new culture we are creating together.

HOW TO GET HERE

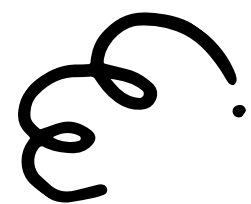
We are in the little village of Artieda, Navarra, not to be confused with another Artieda that is in Zaragoza.

- By car: On the N150 between Pamplona and Lumbier. At the entrance of the village of Artieda (coming from Pamplona) there is a crossway leading to the village of Grez on the right. After the crossway, continue around 300 m and turn left to the parking.
- By bus: Check ALSA website and CONDA buses for updated schedules. Bare in mind there are not many options and weekends will be even more limited. Contact us if you find no options that suit you.
- Train: Pamplona is connected by train. Search in RENFE.
- Plane: International airports near: Bilbao, Zaragoza, Biarritz. There is an airport in Pamplona, with international link via FRANKFURT . Some people fly to Barcelona or Madrid and take the train from there.

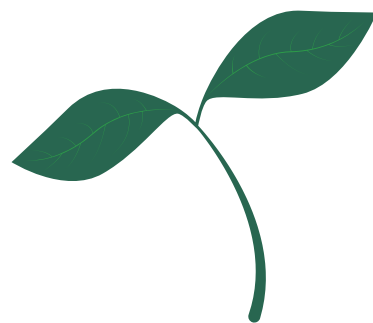




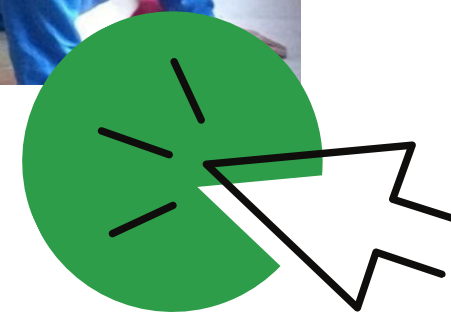
